

Workshop by Northern Ireland – LTTA Bulgaria May 2017

PARTICIPANTS – 20 Grade 7 pupils, European partners, teachers

Duration – 1hr 30

OBJECTIVE – To introduce the Bulgarian pupils and teachers to the many wonderful tourist attractions in Northern Ireland. Explore places of historical and cultural interest, such as Giant's Causeway and Titanic.

To develop and enrich pupils' knowledge of Northern Ireland's historical links with the Titanic – focus on where Titanic was built and the onward journey of Titanic.

ACTIVITIES

Show pupils and teachers power point of attractions in Northern Ireland. Focus on information regarding Titanic. Find out what information pupils and teachers already know about Titanic.

PUPIL ACTIVITY – MAKE A TITANIC PORTHOLE WITH CRAFT MATERIALS

Posters of portholes distributed amongst pupils – discussion about shape and what would be seen through Titanic's porthole.

Pupils sketch what they think could be seen through Titanic's porthole i.e iceberg /passing ships, ocean, sea etc

Using a paper plate as a porthole, pupils will then attach their sketch and decorate porthole with a range of scrap materials to finish.

GALLERY SESSION

Pupils display their finished porthole designs for peers and European visitors. Discussion about what they might have seen during their journey on board Titanic.

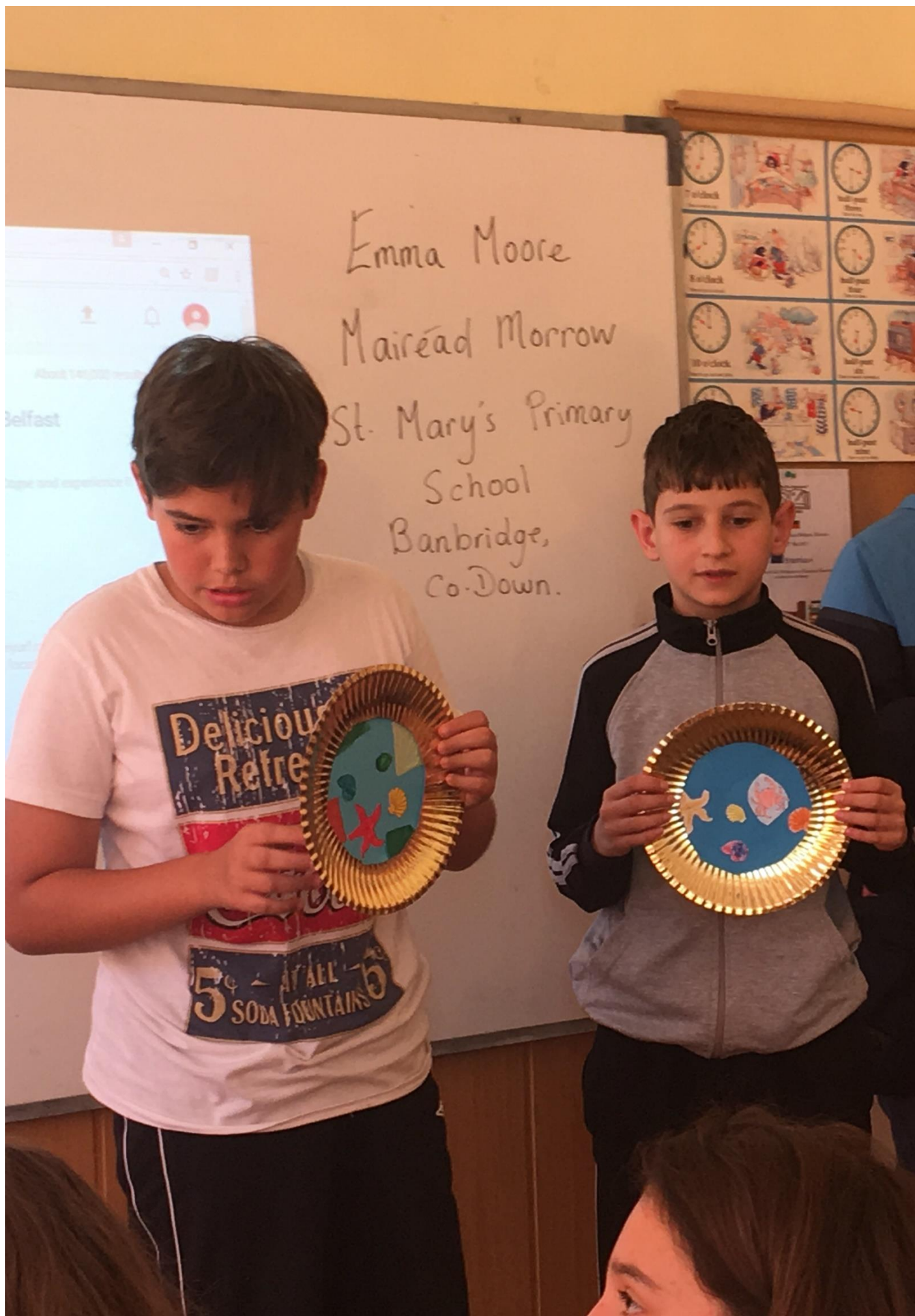
OUTCOMES

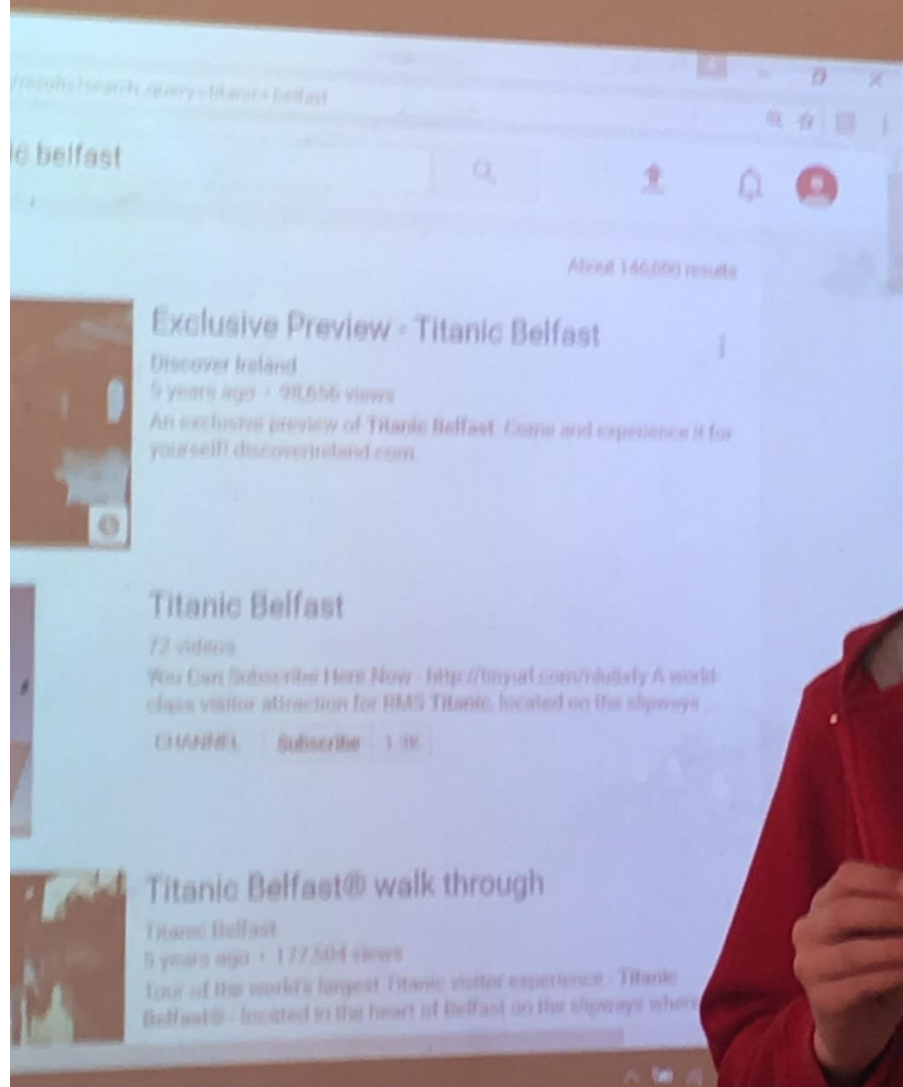
Lesson proved to be a great success. Partners and participants had many opportunities to develop their spoken English through discussions about Titanic and listening to modelled English speakers.

Pupils were introduced to new vocabulary and were encouraged to use this in discussions with their peers and partners.

Pupils have a better knowledge of geographical aspect of Northern Ireland and where it is in relation to other European countries. They have a better understanding of historical links of Titanic to Belfast.

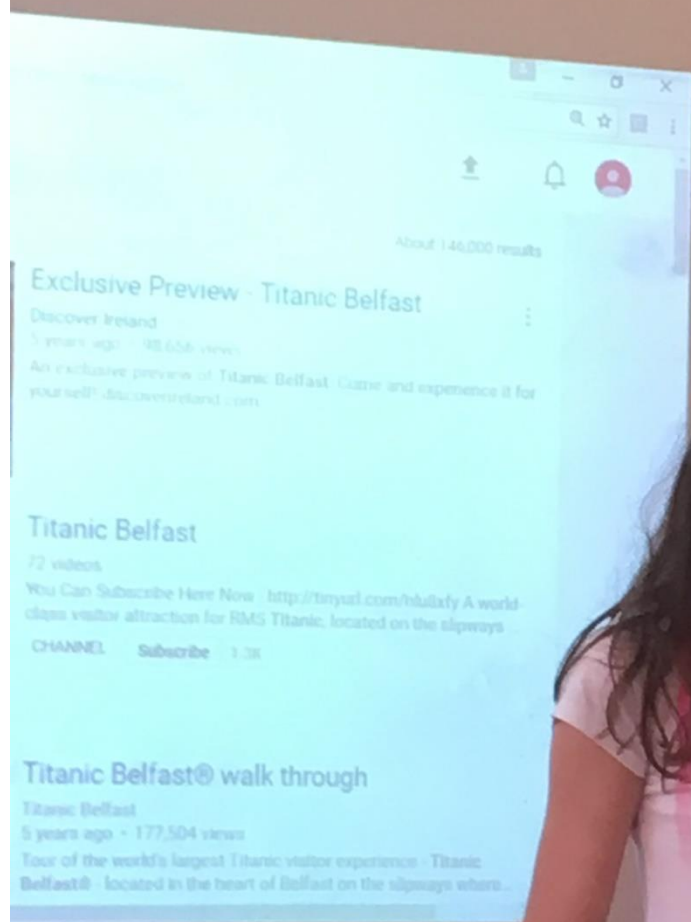
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
